2	Bold, easy to understand, persuasive, a picture or diagram.	
3	A model that looks like an Anderson Shelter. Use household scrap materials. Remember this shelter is not supposed to be luxurious.	
4	Clear instructions, Use of the 2 <sup>nd</sup> person, bold, easy to read, diagrams and a list of materials you will need.	
5	A model of a gas mask that can be worn. Use household scrap items. Make a small box to keep it in.	
6	Bold, easy to understand, persuasive, a picture or diagram.	
7	Research the sorts of souvenirs children collected during World War 2. A log of the different souvenirs. Explanations of preference.	
8	First person, past tense, feelings, observations and vocabulary	
9	A map, an itinerary in chronological order. This will include the meeting point, time of trains, train changes, time of arrival	
10	Formal letter layout, feelings, descriptions and an addressed envelope. Remember that the people who are receiving this letter want to know all about what you have been up to.	
11	This recount should be told like an exciting story. Include VCOP, a build, the problem and the failure.
